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#### **Overview of Perkins Performance Calculations**

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#### What is a...

- CTE concentrator means, at the secondary school level, a student served by an eligible recipient who has completed either:
  - Two high school credits in courses identified with a given CTE program, or
  - One high school credit and two dual-enrollment credits in courses identified with a given CTE program.



#### **Reporting Measures Secondary**

251	Academic Proficiency, Reading/Langua ge Arts	CTE Concentrators who were enrolled in the reporting year and who took an FSA Exam in English Language Arts (ELA).	Those students from the denominator who scored a Level 3 or above on the FSA/FSAA ELA exam on the most recently taken grade level assessment.
252	Academic Proficiency, Mathematics	CTE Concentrators who were enrolled in the reporting year and who took a mathematics FSA, high school level mathematic exam (Algebra I EOC or Geometry EOC) or alternative assessment. 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#### **Other Reporting Areas**

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#### CTE Dual Enrollment – Statutory Criteria (F.S. 1007.271)

- Students must meet the following eligibility criteria:
  - Be enrolled as a student in a Florida public or nonpublic secondary school (grades 6-12), or in a home education program;
  - Have a 2.0 high school unweighted GPA to enroll in career dual enrollment courses;
  - Meet any additional eligibility criteria specified by the postsecondary institution in the Dual Enrollment Articulation Agreement;
  - Cannot be scheduled to graduate prior to the completion of the dual enrollment course; and
  - Career dual enrollment shall be provided as a curricular option for secondary students to pursue *in order to earn industry certifications* adopted pursuant to s. 1008.44



#### Basic Skills Requirements for Career Dual Enrollment, s. 1004.91 and s. 1011.80

- Section 1004.91(2), Florida Statutes "Students who enroll in a program offered for career credit of 450 hours or more shall complete an entry-level examination within the first 6 weeks after admission into the program"
  - Rule 6A-10.040, Basic Skills Requirements for Postsecondary Career and Technical Certificate Education – states that "students who are enrolled in a postsecondary program offered for career education credit of 450 hours or more shall complete an entry-level basic skills examination within the first six (6) weeks after admission into the program."
- Section 1011.80(1), Florida Statutes: "A student may not be reported for funding in a dual enrollment workforce education program unless the student has completed the basic skills assessment pursuant to s. 1004.91."



### **CTE Dual Enrollment - Checklist** Your district should have:

- Process for evaluating GPA for entry into a dual enrollment program
- Process for continuous evaluation of GPA
- Process for ensuring students are not enrolled in courses that cannot be completed prior to graduation
- Process for completing a basic skills examination within the first six weeks of enrollment
- Data validation to ensure the data is reported correctly in both reporting systems

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## **Dual Enrollment - District**

- How it should be reported
  - Students in CTE dual enrollment are reported with a dual enrollment indicator of "C" in EIS and WDIS
  - Students should be reported in EIS and WDIS under the same **postsecondary** CTE program and course number
  - Industry Certification Format: postsecondary program number and certification code IF certification code is on Appendix Z (EIS)



#### **Basic Skills Reporting- DOE Order No. 2020-EO-01**

- A new reportable code has been added to the CTE Basic Skills data element
- **Code "W"-** Student has demonstrated mastery of the required minimal level of basic skills for the program in which the student is enrolled per DOE Order No. 2020-EO-01. For the 2019-20 school year, programs are authorized to assess basic skills by any reasonable means and are not limited to the assessments listed in Rule 6A-10.040, F.A.C. or bound by the time limits set forth in order to exit a student who meets all other criteria for completion of a clock hour certificate program that is 450 hours or greater.
- Reported in WDIS and CCTCMIS
- Students who met basic skills through an approved assessment list in Rule 6A-10.040, F.A.C should continue to be reported using code "Y"

#### **Secondary CTE Formats**

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### **Industry Certification (1 of 4)**

 Submit a record during reporting period 5 for each Industry Certification Identifier and Industry Certification Outcome, including those linked to a career-themed course. Applies to students in grades KG-12. The outcome reported should be the final outcome for the reporting year.



#### **Industry Certification (2 of 4)**

 SCHOOL YEAR: Report both the school year in which the course was taken and the school year of record submission. The school years will be the same for most records. The school year will be different when reporting students who took or attempted an industry certification or technical skill attainment assessment in a year subsequent to the school year in which the student took the course.



#### **Industry Certification (3 of 4)**

- Include dual enrollment courses if the student took an industry certification or technical skill assessment listed in Appendix Z that is related to the dual enrollment course. Also refer to data element, Dual Enrollment Institution Type.
- COURSE NUMBER: Report the career and technical education course number, career-themed course number or basic course number in which the certification was attempted/earned. If the course is not a career and technical education course report all zeros for the program number.



#### **Industry Certification (4 of 4)**

- INDUSTRY CERTIFICATION IDENTIFIER: Report the Industry Certification Identifier from Appendix Z for students who took or attempted an industry certification or technical skill attainment assessment the current school year in the reporting district in an area that applies to the course in which the student participated.
- CAREER AND PROFESSIONAL ACADEMY IDENTIFIER: Report the CAPE academy associated with the Industry Certification Identifier reported. If there is no CAPE academy associated with the reported Industry Certification, report ZZZ in this field.



### **Student Demographic Information (1 of 2)**

For reporting period 5 submit this record for any student

- who was in membership at any time during the school year,
- who was expected to attend school but did not enter as expected
- for whom a Diploma Type of W43, W45, W52, W54, W55, W58 or W59 is being reported on the Student End of Year Status record,
- who was identified as migrant ages 0-21, was not enrolled in school and has not graduated from high school,
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### **Student Demographic Information (2 of 2)**

- who was identified as migrant ages 0-21, and served in a home education setting,
- who participated in a Title I, Part C (Migrant) program at a private school,
- who has been identified as disabled and received services provided by a district through a services plan, or
- who participated in a Title I program at a private school.



#### Student End of Year Status (1 of 2)

 Submit this record during reporting period 5 for all PK-12 students who were in membership in the district at any time during either the regular school year or its associated summer session, any PK-12 student who was expected to attend school but did not enter (DNE) as expected for unknown reasons, and any student for whom a Diploma Type of W43, W45, W52, W54, W55, W58, W59, W60, W61, W62 or W63 is being reported.



#### Student End of Year Status (2 of 2)

 Two Student End of Year Status records may be submitted for a student. This can occur when a high school student leaves the PK-12 program and receives an Adult Standard High School Diploma (Diploma Type W43, W52, W54, W55, W58, W59, W60, W61, W62 or W63) or a State of Florida Diploma (GED) (Diploma Type W45). In this instance, one End of Year Status record will be submitted with Grade Level PK-12 and one with Grade Level 30-31.



#### **CTE Student Course (1 of 2)**

- Submit a separate record during reporting period 5 for each Career and Technical Education (CTE) and applicable Career and Technical Education exceptional education course in which the student was in membership during the current school year and the associated summer session(s) for the current school year.
- COURSE NUMBER: Report the career and technical education course number.



#### **CTE Student Course (2 of 2)**

 CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION/ADULT GENERAL EDUCATION PROGRAM CODE: Report the CTE/AGE Program Code for the CTE course number as listed in the Career and Technical Education/Adult General Education Program Edit file (F61730).



#### **CTE Teacher Course**

 Submit a separate record for each combination of Course Number, Section Number, Period Number, Social Security Number and Term on the Career and Technical Educational Teacher Course format for each combination of Course Number, Section Number, Period Number, and Term submitted on the Career and Technical Educational Student Course format during Survey 5. No Career and Technical Educational Teacher Course records are needed, however, for prior year courses reported on the Career and Technical Educational Student Course format, for Course Numbers of zero and for dual-enrollment courses LDOE.org



#### **2020-21 Reporting Changes**

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#### **Secondary OCP Reporting**

- Beginning with 2020-21, secondary curriculum frameworks will no longer include Occupational Completion Point Codes
  - The data element has been deleted from the 2020-21 EIS handbook and from the CTE student course schedule
- For 2019-20, we will not be validating OCP data reporting
- We are working with the BEESS division on updates to the Modified Occupational Completion point code data element



### **Data Element Changes for Perkins V**

- Updates to Internship Participant (DE141025)
  - Reported on the CTE Student Course Schedule
- New data element to capture Work-Based learning activities
- Addition of Apprenticeship Sponsor Code to the CTE Student Course Schedule and development of a new appendices of reportable codes
