Current K-12 Preapprenticeship Activity

- High School Preapprenticeship RA program sponsors are now encouraged to sponsor preapprenticeship programs in high schools. High school students, who are enrolled in a Career and Technical Education (CTE) program of study that aligns with an occupation(s) of an RA program, may be invited to register in a preapprenticeship program that can provide a pathway to employment after graduating high school. The FDOE's Apprenticeship Section has been actively working with school districts and apprenticeship program sponsors to design Standards of Preapprenticeship to offer 11th and 12th grade students.
- Below are a few examples:
 - Clay County School Board Preapprenticeship Program for the following occupations: Carpenter, Electrician and Heating & Air Conditioning Installer-Servicer
 - Hillsborough County Public Schools Preapprenticeship Program for the following occupations: Ironworker and Carpenter
 - St. Lucie Public Schools Preapprenticeship Program for the following occupations: Carpenter and Industrial Manufacturing Technician

CTE Dual Enrollment Rule 6A-6.057, Clock Hour Dual Enrollment for School and District Accountability



Background

- During the 2020 legislative session, the Governor signed SB 434, Designation of School Grades, which went into effect July 1, 2020
- SB 434 amended the *college and career acceleration component* of the school grade formula to include a percentage of students who complete 300 or more clock hours of approved career dual enrollment courses per s.1007.271, F.S.
- An approved course list was created through collaboration with FCS institutions and district technical centers and a Rule development workshop held on April 21, 2021.
- Approved list went before the SBE and was approved on June 10, 2021
- The rule will officially become effective July 14, 2021 and be retroactively applied for the 2020-2021 academic year.

6A-6.0575 Clock Hour Dual Enrollment for School and District Accountability

(1) Purpose. The purpose of this rule is to:

(a) Aid student acceleration, as part of the College and Career Acceleration component framework in Rule 6A-1.09981(4)(c)2. F.A.C.;

(b) Specify the procedures, course requirements, and reporting criteria for clock hour dual enrollment courses for inclusion in the College and Career Acceleration component in school and district grades in Rule 6A-1.09981, F.A.C.; and

(c) Adopt a clock hour career dual enrollment course list for eligibility in the school and district grading calculation in Rule 6A-1.09981, F.A.C.

6A-6.0575 Clock Hour Dual Enrollment for School and District Accountability

(2) Definitions. The following definitions shall be used in this rule and incorporated documents.

(a) “Clock hour dual enrollment courses” means postsecondary courses creditable toward high school completion and a career certificate or an applied technology diploma degree, measured in clock hours.

(b) “Completion” means the awarding of high school credit upon student completion of the entire clock hour course. Withdrawals, incompletes, and letter grades that do not result in credit are not completions.

6A-6.0575 Clock Hour Dual Enrollment for School and District Accountability

(3) In order for a clock hour course to be included in the College and Career Acceleration component of the school and district grading calculation, the following conditions must be met:

(a) The course is included on the “2020-2021 Clock Hour Dual Enrollment Course List for School and District Accountability;”

(b) The course or courses completed total at least three-hundred (300) clock hours;

(c) The course or courses totaling at least three-hundred (300) clock hours are included in the same program, as designated by the name and program number on the incorporated list; and

(d) The program in which the course is included must be identified by the Department as leading to an industry certification on the CAPE Industry Certification Funding list or the CAPE Postsecondary Industry Certification Funding List as specified in ss. 1008.44 and 1011.62(1), F.S., and adopted in Rules 6A-6.0573 and 6A-6.0574, F.A.C., for the year in which the course was taken.

6A-6.0575 Clock Hour Dual Enrollment for School and District Accountability

(4) The “2020-2021 Clock Hour Dual Enrollment Course List for School and District Accountability”, effective July 2021 (DOS link) is incorporated by reference in this rule. The list may be obtained from the Department of Education, Room 744, Turlington Building, 325 West Gaines Street, Tallahassee, FL 32399.

(5) Reporting Criteria.

(a) Any eligible course must be reported on the Student Course Transcript Information of the Student Information System for K-12 reporting, as referenced in rule 6A-1.0014, F.A.C.

(b) A course may only be reported upon student completion of the entire course.

(c) Clock hour dual enrollment courses will only be eligible for inclusion in school and district accountability upon the completion of a course or courses totaling three-hundred (300) or more clock hours.

Through the work of the [Articulation Coordinating Committee \(ACC\)](#), a K-20 advisory body appointed by the Commissioner of Education, our office coordinates ways to help students move easily from institution to institution and from one level of education to the next.

Students who earn required scores on nationally and internationally recognized assessments may receive college credit for their demonstrated mastery in these college-level subject areas. Students may transfer up to 45 credit hours based on their credit-by-examination scores.

Dual Enrollment

Dual enrollment is an acceleration program that allows Florida's secondary students, including home education students and students with disabilities, to take postsecondary classes to earn credit toward a high school diploma, and a career certificate, an industry certification, or an associate or baccalaureate degree at a Florida public or eligible private institution.
