SESIR Basics

- Developed 1995 for school staff
- Based on criminal code
- 26 incident categories reported
- Each incident may have related elements: alcohol, bullying, drug, gang, hate-crime, hazing, injury, vaping or weapon



SESIR Incidents

- On school grounds, school transportation, or at off-campus school sponsored events
- The most serious offense (reported as Incident, Type) is the primary SESIR incident.
 Secondary offenses can be reported as one or more "related elements".
- 365 days/24 hours
- Student, Non-Student, <u>Out-of-District</u>
 <u>Student</u>, <u>School Personnel</u> or Unknown
 Offenders



SESIR Reporting

- SESIR incidents are <u>per incident</u>. Report only ONE incident even when there are multiple students involved in the same incident.
- Discipline actions are <u>per student</u>.

Updated SESIR Definitions 2021-22



Aggravated Battery

Level I

A battery where the attacker intentionally or knowingly causes more serious injury, such as: great bodily harm, permanent disability, or permanent disfigurement; uses a deadly weapon; or, where the attacker knew or should have known the victim was pregnant.



Alcohol Level IV

Possession, sale, purchase, or use of alcoholic beverages. Use means the person is caught in the act of using, admits to use or is discovered to have used in the course of an investigation. <u>Alcohol incidents</u> cannot be <u>Drug-related</u>.



Other Major Incidents

Level III

Any serious, harmful incident resulting in the need for law enforcement consultation not previously classified. This includes any drug or weapon found unattended and not linked to any individual; such incidents must be coded with the appropriate Related element (such as Drug-related or Weapon-related) and incident involvement must be reported as unknown.



Threat/Intimidation

Level III

An incident where there was no physical contact between the offender and victim, but the victim felt that physical harm could have occurred based on verbal or nonverbal communication by the offender. This includes nonverbal threats (e.g., brandishing a weapon) and verbal threats of physical harm which are made in person, electronically or through any other means.



Tobacco Level IV

The possession, use, distribution, or sale of tobacco or nicotine products on school grounds, at school-sponsored events, or on school transportation by any person under the age of 21. <u>Tobacco incidents</u> <u>cannot be Drug-related</u>.



Weapons Possession

Level II

Possession of a firearm or any instrument or object as defined by Section 790.001, F.S., or district code of conduct that can inflict serious harm on another person or that can place a person in reasonable fear of serious harm.
