Data Quality



Data Quality Does Not Happen in a "Silo"

- Data quality starts at the source not at the send.
- Collaboration between district program staff and management information systems (MIS) staff is critical.
 - Data shared is data improved.
- There are numerous reports available to schools.
 - Many should be shared with the relevant district-level program areas.
- MIS/IS staff can request reports (NWRDC CICS Student Component Menu / Option 26 – Reports for Request).

Why is the End of State Processing Critical?

- Preliminary recalibrated full-time equivalent (FTE) files are produced.
- Ad hoc requests.
- Daily processing ends.

Survey Re-Opening



Survey Re-Opening Process

- Formal, written request must:
 - Be made on district letterhead.
 - Be signed by the district's Superintendent or their designee.
 - Be addressed to the Commissioner of Education.
 - Include a detailed explanation as to what needs to be amended and why.
 - Impacts to District
 - Impacts to State

Only the Commissioner can authorize the re-opening of a survey once closed.



Common Survey Re-Opening Reasons

- Insufficient mainframe report review.
- Technical/system issues with district student information system (SIS) or human resource (HR) system.
- Lack of response to Education Information and Accountability Services (ASKEIAS) and/or FTE Reports.

Data Quality Resources

- The DQ2 system is comprised of two areas:
 - Survey Preflight system.
 - Survey Production system.
- Preflight:
 - STUDENT and STAFF systems can utilize the DQ2 Preflight system to prepare quality data in advance of production survey file processing.
 - Data residing in Preflight is not used by the FDOE in official reporting.
- Production:
 - STAFF system can utilize DQ2 Production during the official survey windows.
 - PK-12 STUDENT system must use the Northwest Regional Data Center (NWRDC) for reporting production data.
 - Production data is used by FDOE for data quality and reporting.
