High School Preapprenticeship Delivery Methods

- Preapprenticeship course numbers implemented 2018-19
- FLDOE does not mandate the use of the preapprenticeship course number. An agency may use them or other CTE course numbers of choice.
- 2020-21 course enrollments in 8000110, 8000120, 8000130, 8000140
 - Miami-Dade
 - Okaloosa
 - Pasco



Data Reporting Guidance

- If a student is enrolled in any of the apprenticeship or preapprenticeship course numbers, there must be an associated apprenticeship sponsor code reported.
- Speak with respective agency CTE Director to learn of all preapprenticeship programs offered within agency high schools, including those that use a non-apprenticeship course number delivery method.
- Report all preapprenticeship activity.

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Apprenticeship Reporting Edits

- 2022-23
 - Potential data reporting edits:
 - If agency uses an apprenticeship or preapprenticeship course number an apprenticeship sponsor code will be required or record will be rejected.

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Annual Apprenticeship Report Requirements

- §446.032 General duties of the department for apprenticeship training.—The department shall:
- (1) Establish uniform minimum standards and policies governing apprenticeship and preapprenticeship programs and agreements which must require training providers to submit data necessary to determine program performance consistent with state and federal law. The standards and policies shall govern the terms and conditions of the apprentice's employment and training, including the quality training of the apprentice for, but not limited to, such matters as ratios of apprentices to journeyworkers, safety, related instruction and on-thejob training; but these standards and policies may not include rules, standards, or guidelines that require the use of apprentices and job trainees on state, county, or municipal contracts. The department shall adopt rules necessary to administer the standards and policies.



Annual Apprenticeship Report Requirements cont.

- §446.032 General duties of the department for apprenticeship training.—The department shall:
- (2) By September 1 of each year, publish an annual report on apprenticeship and preapprenticeship programs. The report must be published on the department's website and, at a minimum, include all of the following:
- (a) A list of registered apprenticeship and preapprenticeship programs, sorted by local educational agency, as defined in s. 1004.02(18), and apprenticeship sponsor, under s. 446.071.
- (b) A detailed summary of each local educational agency's expenditure of funds for apprenticeship and preapprenticeship programs, including:
 - 1. The total amount of funds received for apprenticeship and preapprenticeship programs.
 - 2. The total amount of funds allocated by training provider, program, and occupation.
 - 3. The total amount of funds expended for administrative costs by training provider, program, and occupation.





Annual Apprenticeship Report Requirements cont.

4. The total amount of funds expended for instructional costs by training provider, program, and occupation.

(c) The number of apprentices and preapprentices per trade and occupation.

(d) The percentage of apprentices and preapprentices who complete their respective programs in the appropriate timeframe.
(e) Information and resources related to applications for new apprenticeship programs and technical assistance and requirements for potential applicants.

(f) Documentation of activities conducted by the department to promote apprenticeship and preapprenticeship programs through public engagement, community-based partnerships, and other initiatives and the outcomes of such activities and their impact on establishing or expanding apprenticeship and preapprenticeship programs.

(g) Retention and completion rates of participants disaggregated by training provider, program, and occupation.
(h) Wage progression of participants as demonstrated by starting, exit, and postapprenticeship wages at 1 and 5 years after participants exit the program.



Pathways to Career Opportunities Grants Reporting Requirements

1011.802 Florida Pathways to Career Opportunities Grant Program.—

(4) The department shall annually report on its website:

(a) The number of programs funded and represented throughout the state under this section.

(b) Retention, completion and employment rates, categorized by program and provider.

(c) Starting and ending salaries, as categorized by program and provider, for participants who complete the program.





Apprenticeship – New Rulemaking

6A-23.011 Program Performance Standards.

- (1) Every registered apprenticeship program must have at least one (1) registered apprentice, except for the following specified periods of time, which may not exceed one (1) year:
- (a) Between the date when a program is registered and the date of registration for its first apprentice(s); or
- (b) Between the date that a program graduates an apprentice and the date of registration for the next apprentice(s) in the program.
- (2) The Department must evaluate performance of registered apprenticeship programs. The tools and factors to be used must include, but are not limited to, the following:
- (a) Quality assurance assessments;
- (b) Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) Compliance Reviews;
- (c) Retention rates. Completion rates and Wage progression metrics;
- (d) Adherence to the approved program standards; and
- (e) Compliance with rules relating to apprenticeship programs established in Chapter 6A-23, F.A.C.





Apprenticeship – New Rulemaking cont.

- (3) Accountability Reporting for Registered Apprenticeship and Preapprenticeship Programs. The Department shall calculate and publish retention rates, completion rates and wage progression metrics annually for all registered apprenticeship and preapprenticeship programs based upon the registered sponsor, program and occupation.
- (a) Retention rate will be calculated as the percentage of apprentices or preapprentices retained or completing a program by the end of fourth quarter after the initial quarter of enrollment in a registered apprenticeship or preapprentieship program.
- (b) Completion rate will be calculated as the percentage of apprentices or preapprentices completing the registered apprenticeship or preapprenticeship program within one (1) year after the expected program length identified in the program standards.
- (c) Wage progression of participants will be calculated by registered program sponsor and occupation for the following periods: starting wage as identified in the current program standards, exit wage as identified by the wage scale for the last year in the current program standards, and post-apprenticeship completion wages calculated at one (1) and five (5) years after program exit based upon annual cohorts of program completers who are tracked using administrative records of employment and wages that are available to the Department.





Apprenticeship – New Rulemaking con't

- (4) The Department must review a program's completion rates in comparison to the national average for completion rates. Based on the review, the Department must provide technical assistance to programs with completion rates lower than the national average.
- (5) Cancellation of apprenticeship agreements during the probationary period will not have an adverse impact on a sponsor's completion rate.
- Rulemaking Authority 446.032, 446.041(13) FS. Law Implemented 446.052 FS, History–New 3-29-11, Amended 6-25-19, 5-3-22. The rules relating to apprenticeship programs established in Chapter 6A-23, F.A.C.

RAPIDS

- United State Department of Labor national data collection system for apprenticeship programs
- Data entered by Apprenticeship Program Sponsors
 - Often with LEA assistance/sometimes LEA is program sponsor
 - Start date, completion date, start wage, ending wage, apprenticeship program information, etc.

• Related Training & Instruction (RTI)

- Required classroom instruction hours
- On-the-Job-Training (OJT)
 - Required on-the-job training
- Apprenticeship Year
 - July 1 June 30
- Cohorts
 - July September
 - October December
 - January March
 - April June





Retention Rates

Retention Rates

 The percentage of apprentices or preapprentices <u>retained or</u> <u>completing</u> a program by the **end of fourth quarter** after the initial quarter of enrollment in a registered apprenticeship or preapprentieship program.

• Data Source:

- Apprentices: RAPIDS
- Pre-Apprentices: Pre-apprentice program
- **Cohort:** Apprentices who were active July 1 June 30 of report year.
 - Ex: For the 21-22 Annual Apprenticeship Report, the cohort is apprentices who were active July 1, 2020 June 30, 2021





Completion Rates

Completion Rates

- The percentage of apprentices or preapprentices completing the registered apprenticeship or preapprenticeship program within one (1) year after the expected program length identified in the program standards.
- Data Source: RAPIDS
 - Apprentices: RAPIDS
 - Pre-Apprentices: Pre-apprentice program
- **Cohort**: Apprentices who were active July 1 June 30 of report year.
 - Ex: For the 21-22 Annual Apprenticeship Report, the cohort is apprentices who were active July 1, 2020 June 30, 2021





Wage Progression

- Wage Progression
 - Will be calculated by registered program sponsor and occupation for the following periods: starting wage as identified in the current program standards, exit wage as identified by the wage scale for the last year in the current program standards, and post-apprenticeship completion wages calculated at one (1) and five (5) years after program exit based upon annual cohorts of program completers who are tracked using administrative records of employment and wages that are available to the Department.
- Data source: FETPIP
- **Cohort**: Lagged cohorts to allow one year and five years of time to calculate rates.
 - **One year**: Apprenticeship completers who exited July 1, 2019 June 30, 2020
 - Five years: Apprenticeship completers who exited July 1, 2015 –June 30,
 2016
